## City of Stockton Accepting Applications for Eight Commissions

(Stockton, CA) - The City of Stockton is currently accepting applications for eight committees and commissions:

- Climate Action Plan Advisory Committee
- Central Parking District
- Parks and Recreation Commission
- Civil Service/Equal Employment Commission
- Measure W Oversight Committee
- Port Commission
- San Joaquin County Regional Transit District
- Community Development Committee

To be considered for appointment, those interested must submit an application online at <a href="https://www.stocktonca.gov/bcvacancies">www.stocktonca.gov/bcvacancies</a>. The City will be accepting applications until vacancies are filled.

The Climate Action Plan Advisory Committee is a ten (10) member committee that serves as an advisory body to the City Council and makes recommendations on Climate Action Plan activities within the City of Stockton. There are two (2) vacancies, one for the environmental category and one for the labor category. The term of service is for two (2) years to begin immediately upon appointment with no term limit. Members meet once a month.

The Central Parking District Advisory Board is a seven (7) member board that serves as an advisory body to the City Council to make recommendations on rules, rates, regulations, and development plans of the Central Parking District. In June 2016, there will be three (3) vacancies. The term of service is for four (4) years to begin July 1, 2016, with a two (2) term limit. Members meet once a month. To qualify, applicants must own real property or be an executive officer or board member of a corporation that owns property within the Central Parking District.

Members of the Parks and Recreation Commission's four (4) member commission act as the agents of the governing bodies they represent e.g., the City of Stockton; County of San Joaquin; and the Lincoln, Lodi, Manteca, and Stockton Unified School Districts.

There is one (1) vacancy. The term of service is for four (4) years to begin upon appointment with a two (2) term limit. Members meet once a month. To qualify, applicants must be a resident of the City of Stockton.

The Civil Service/Equal Employment Commission is a five (5) member commission that establishes suitable rules and regulations for the administration of the City's Civil Service System to investigate matters related to the enforcement of rules and regulations,

hear appeals regarding administration of the Civil Service System, and serve as the City's Equal Employment Commission. In June 2016, there will be two (2) vacancies. The term of service is for three (3) years to begin July 1, 2016, with a two (2) term limit. Members meet once a month. To qualify, applicants must be a registered voter in the City of Stockton and must not hold any other public office, place, or position of employment with the City of Stockton.

The Measure W Oversight Committee is a seven (7) member committee that assures appropriate use of Measure W sales and use tax to present an annual report to the City Council. In June 2016, there will be one (1) vacancy. The term of service is for two (2) years to begin on July 1, 2016, for a two (2) term limit. Members meet as needed. To qualify, applicants must be at least 28 years of age, reside within the City's geographic boundary, and cannot be employed by, contract, consult, or do any business with the City of Stockton.

The Port Commissioner is an eight (8) member commission that exercises general supervision over the Port of Stockton by adopting general rules and regulations to best promote the interests of the Port as established under State Law. In June 2016, there will be one (1) City of Stockton vacancy. The term of service of four (4) years begins on July 1, 2016, with no term limit. Members meet twice a month. To qualify applicants must have resided in the Port District at least one year prior to appointment (Harbors & Navigation Code Section 6244); or consistent with City General Plan boundaries, within a one-half mile strip on either side of the Stockton Ship Channel from the Port to Disappointment Slough.

The San Joaquin Regional Transit District Board is a five (5) member board that supervises and regulates facilities owned and operated by the Transit District, including fixing of rates, rentals, charges and classifications; and creating and enforcing rules, regulations, contracts, practices, and schedules. In June 2016, there will be one (1) City of Stockton vacancy. The term of service is four (4) years to begin July 1, 2015, with no term limit. Members meet once a month. To qualify, applicants must be a resident of the City of Stockton.

The Community Development Committee is a seven (7) member committee that acts as an advisory body to the City Council, studies Housing Department data to recommend ongoing project funding levels; reviews Department of Housing and Urban Development applications; and meets with area residents to analyze community support for newly designated areas. In September 2016, there will be two (2) vacancies, one from District 3 and one from District 6. The term of service begins October 1, 2016, with two (2) term limit.
