Current Status

- 135,953 total COVID-19 Cases (+15,989 since 1/14/22)
- 1,957 total COVID-19 related deaths (+1 since 1/14/22)
 - No deaths related to Omicron at this time in SJC.
- Testing Positivity Rate 29.4% (+1.9% in 7 days)
- 420,827 fully vaccinated residents (61%), 153,139 partially vaccinated (22.2%)¹
- SJC Hospitals (+66.7% in past 7 days)
 - 195 hospitalized COVID+ Patients (24%)
 - 44 COVID+ Patients in ICU (37%)²

Types of COVID-19 Testing

There are two different types of tests: diagnostic and serologic.

- Diagnostic tests can show if you have an active COVID-19 infection. Currently there are two types of diagnostic tests, molecular tests (PCR) that detect the virus genetic material and antigen tests that detect specific proteins from the virus. (Rapid) Antigen tests are not recommended for one-time testing of asymptomatic individuals as they are less sensitive than molecular tests.
- Serologic tests look for antibodies to the COVID-19 virus in someone who was previously infected.

COVID-19 Therapeutics

While there are a number of COVID-19 therapeutic products available in San Joaquin County, they are **available by prescription only**. If you have tested positive for COVID-19, please check with your primary care provider to see if you meet medical criteria.

Masking Requirements³

Due to rising COVID-19 rates and hospitalizations, California currently requires EVERYONE to wear a mask in indoor public places (such as grocery stores and movie theaters) regardless of vaccination status. Masks are also still required for public transit (airports, planes, trains, buses and stations) and health care settings.

Mega Event Requirements

Effective January 15, 2022- Mega Events are characterized by large crowds greater than 500 indoor OR 5,000 outdoor attendees. Mega Events may have either assigned or unassigned seating, and may be either general admission or gated, ticketed, and permitted events. Mega Events do not include venues such as shopping malls or museums that are open to public circulation as part of their regular operations, except to the extent that such venues host qualifying events.

Restrictions Applying to Indoor & Outdoor Settings

Vaccine Verification / Negative Testing	Required for Indoor Mega Events Recommended for Outdoor Mega Events
Capacity Limitations	No restrictions
Physical Distancing	No restrictions for attendees, customers, and guests
Masking	Follow current CDPH Guidance for Face Coverings
Travelers	Recommend following CDC and CDPH Travel recommendations.

In workplaces, employers are subject to the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS) or in some workplaces the CalOSHA Aerosol Transmissible Diseases Standard, and should consult those regulations for additional applicable requirements.

Isolation and Quarantine

Exposed to Someone with COVID-19 Quarantine	What To Do
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unvaccinated; OR • Vaccinated and booster-eligible but not yet received booster dose.** <p>CDC COVID-19 Booster Shots to determine who booster eligible</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stay home at least 5 days after last contact with person who has COVID-19. • Test on Day 5. • Quarantine ends after Day 5 if symptoms gone and test on Day 5 or later is negative. • If no test and symptoms not present, quarantine can end after Day 10. • Wear fitted mask around others for 10 days, especially indoors • Get vaccinated or boosted. • If test positive, follow isolation recommendations. • If symptoms develop, test and stay home.

** Workplace only; not apply to healthcare personnel
 In a workplace, asymptomatic employees not required to stay home from work if:

- Negative test within 3-5 days after last exposure to a case
- Employee wears fitted mask around others for 10 days
- Employee continues to have no symptoms.



If Exposed to Someone with COVID-19 No Quarantine	What To Do
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Boosted OR • Vaccinated, but not yet booster-eligible <p>CDC COVID-19 Booster Shots to determine who booster eligible</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Test on Day 5. • Wear fitted mask around others for 10 days, especially in indoors • If test positive, follow isolation recommendations. • If symptoms develop, test and stay home.

If Test Positive for COVID-19 Isolation	What To Do
<p>For everyone... regardless of vaccination status, previous infection, or lack of symptoms.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stay home for at least 5 days. • Isolation can end after Day 5 if symptoms not present or resolving and test collected on Day 5 or later is negative. <i>Antigen test preferred.</i> • If no test and symptoms not present or resolving, isolation can end after Day 10. • If fever present, continue isolation until fever resolves. • If symptoms other than fever not resolving, continue to isolate until symptoms are resolving or until after day 10. • Wear fitted mask around others for 10 days, especially indoors
