

### SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY - REGIONAL STAY HOME ORDER - DECEMBER 6, 2020 - 11:59 P.M.

Governor Gavin Newsom announced that all sectors other than retail and essential operations will close when Regional hospital Intensive Care Unit (ICU) bed capacity has fallen below 15% available capacity.



**Regional Stay Home Order**

California's Regional Stay Home Order goes into effect after a region reaches less than 15% ICU availability.

For our Region, the order goes into effect Sunday, December 6th at 11:59 pm as we have fallen below the threshold.

This is a targeted protective measure to help prevent spread and a strain on our healthcare systems.

We are part of the San Joaquin Valley Region.

If we don't act now, California will reach ICU capacity.

### MUST CLOSE OPERATIONS

**Regional Stay Home Order:** The following sectors must close operations by **December 6, 2020, at 11:59 p.m.**

- Indoor playgrounds (outdoor - open)
- Indoor recreational facilities
- Hair salons and barbershops
- Personal care services - nail salons, tattoo & massage (only w/prescription)
- Museums, zoos, and aquariums
- Movie theaters
- Wineries, bars, breweries, and distilleries (production/distribution can continue)
- Family entertainment centers
- Cardrooms and satellite wagering
- Limited services, such as pet grooming
- Live audience sports
- Amusement parks
- Gyms/Fitness Centers - indoor & outdoor

### MODIFY OPERATIONS - 100% MASKING & PHYSICAL DISTANCING

The following sectors have additional modifications, including 100% masking and physical distancing:

- **Outdoor recreational facilities:** Allow outdoor operation only - without any food, drink, or alcohol sales; overnight stays at campgrounds are not permitted.
- **Retail:** Allow indoor operation at 20% capacity with entrance metering - no eating/drinking in stores. Special hours for seniors and others with chronic conditions or compromised immune systems. **Grocery stores - 35% capacity.**
- **Shopping centers:** Allow indoor operations at 20% capacity with entrance metering - no eating/drinking in stores. Special hours for seniors and others with chronic conditions or compromised immune systems.
- **Hotels and lodging:** Allow to open for critical infrastructure support only.
- **Restaurants:** Allow only for take-out, pick-up, or delivery; closed for indoor and outdoor dining.
- **Offices:** Allow remote only except for critical infrastructure sectors where remote working is not possible.
- **Places of worship and political expression:** Allow outdoor services and political expression only.
- **Entertainment production, including professional sports:** Allow operation without live audiences; testing protocols and "bubbles are highly encouraged.
- **Outdoor and Indoor Recreational Youth and Adult Sports** - Guidance updated December 14, 2020 - San Joaquin County is in Purple Tier 1 and Regional Stay Home Order
- **Real Estate showings:** considered essential workforce; limited to scheduled property viewings to potential buying party; no open house viewings; no viewings with more than one buying party at a time.

### REMAIN OPEN - 100% MASKING & PHYSICAL DISTANCING

The following sectors are allowed to remain open when a remote option is not possible with appropriate infectious disease preventative measures, including 100% masking and physical distancing:

- Critical infrastructure
- Schools (Schools that are currently open are able to continue to provide in-person instruction on school sites.)
- Non-urgent medical and dental care
- Childcare and pre-K, day camps
- Janitorial services
- Funeral homes
