INDEX: Redflex Photo Enforcement Equipment

I. **POLICY**

The retrieval and safe storage of damaged Redflex Red Light Photo Enforcement camera equipment is important to preserve the integrity of the photo enforcement program and prevent the loss or further damage to the equipment.

II. **PROCEDURE**

- A. Officers responding to collisions involving Redflex Red Light Photo Enforcement Camera equipment will handle the scene similar to a collision involving a "downed" city property signal light or other damaged city traffic control device.
- B. Stabilize the scene and contact CTC for the call out of the necessary city personnel. Officers shall complete a crime report or collision report as necessary. The report shall be routed to the "**Photo Enforcement Officer**"
- C. All crime/incident reports or collision reports will be flagged:
ATTENTION: PHOTO ENFORCEMENT OFFICER
- D. CTC will have a City Electrician respond to disconnect exposed wires and remove the Redflex equipment.
- E. The investigating officer will remain on-scene until the electrician arrives. The electrician will take possession of any equipment that is removed from its fixed position and deliver it to the Corporation Yard.
- F. Photo red light equipment that has been dislodged or may become dislodged from its fixed position will not be left at a collision scene.
- G. The Photo Enforcement Program Coordinator will contact Redflex Traffic Systems and make arrangements for the re-installation of the equipment and retrieval of the existing camera system components.
